Site Background

The application site comprises the former Rutland County College on Barleythorpe Road, Oakham and equates to approximately 0.97ha in size. In March 2013, Sainsbury's obtained planning permission to redevelop the site for a supermarket, however they subsequently chose not to progress and made it available to purchase by Lidl. Since the demolition and clearance of the college buildings in 2014 the site has remained vacant.

The Proposal

The proposed development comprises of a new Lidl foodstore with associated access, car parking and landscaping. The store will extend to 2,460 sq.m gross internal area with a net sales of 1,424 sq.m.

The proposed foodstore will be supported by 126 car parking spaces, including 5 dedicated disabled and 7 parent and child spaces and secure cycle storage provision.

A new vehicular access is proposed off Land's End Way in the north-east corner of the site. This will accommodate all traffic to and from the north, including deliveries. All HGVs will route to and from the site via Burley Park Way. The existing access in the south-east corner of the site will be utilised by traffic approaching from Barleythorpe Way. Comprehensive improvements will be provided at this location to address visibility and pedestrian safety issues. A dedicated pedestrian access to the site will also be provided direct from Lands End Way.

It is proposed that the foodstore will be open between the hours of:

- 7am to 10pm Monday to Saturday; and
- 10am to 4pm Sunday.

All waste will be stored within the warehousing area to the rear of the store and will be collected at the same time as deliveries, thereby minimising HGV movements. It should be noted that there will be a maximum of two deliveries per day.





Here's a fresh way to put it.

Our fresh fruit and veg is delivered every morning and kept at the back of the store near the chiller instead of the front so that it stays cooler and fresher. And, because many of our fruit and veg products take less than 24hrs to travel from field to shelf, we only order one day's worth of produce at a time, so that we don't carry over excess stock and you know your fruit and veg is always fresh. Just like you buy it from your local market.

- Improved shopping choice and provision of a new mainstream discount operator for Oakham.
- A contemporary building design that will complement the surrounding area.
- Employment opportunities, including up to 40 new jobs for local residents.
- Landscaping will improve the visual amenity of the site, including a soft landscaped area located along the eastern boundary of the site.


